CEDAR RAPIDS IEEE SECTION REGION 4 NEWSLETTER REPORT - MARCH 2019

It is cold and icy in Iowa now. Lots of confinement indoors kept lighted and heated by technology that keeps us busy in IEEE. SpaceX launched its rocket last night to test out their new crew capsule for return the USA to manned flight! That warms us up. Space is the next frontier for IEEE.

We started planting tomatoes, eggplants and peppers for the Master Gardener donation gardens this week. These seedlings are kept under LED lights on a heated mat at 77 degrees to be transplanted into a greenhouse when the temperatures get above freezing. Many new technologies used in this effort from ordering online, delivery on site, various computer and electronic support for the project. But the human element is still necessary to plant and nurture the seedlings bringing forth new life being produced for humanitarian needs, most importantly food insecurity. The food is used for pantries to feed those in need that do not get nutritious groceries from their other resources.

Unfortunately, those LED lights (or more correctly, the driver electronics for those lights) have the potential to generate considerable RFI. EMC practitioners will be involved in understanding the interference problems and how they can best be mitigated.

The Humanitarian Activity Committee (HAC) presentation at the OpCom 2019 conference illustrated the need for many different types of food and environmental research applications. Support for potential IEE HAC projects was solicited. Cedar Rapids Section will be investigating various opportunities to link Master Gardener type resources with our IEEE volunteers and resources in the HAC initiatives.

IEEE Day 2019 in early October will be when the Cedar Rapids Section will celebrate our 75th IEEE Section Anniversary! We hope to resurrect some of our illustrious past in that event and provide inspiration for future IEEE endeavors. We have many historical technological developments in the Cedar Rapids area mainly due to the Arthur Collins Radio Company (ArthurCollins.org) that became part of Rockwell, then Rockwell Collins and most recently into Collins Aerospace recently acquired by UTC.

The University of Iowa also provided the Van Allen physics pioneering along with the Iowa State University engineering program along with many other colleges in the area in the Cedar Rapids area.

We continue to work in renewing our Student Branches at the University of Iowa that manage to submit their plan by February 1, thanks to our young professionals Secretary Meredith Godar and much utilized Chang Wu, that have been putting on workshops for the universities and community colleges as well as a participant in STEAM. We are also working with University of Northern Iowa. We hope to start a new student branch this year at the local Kirkwood community college.

Our Treasure Bruce Lindholm also the Power and Energy Society Chair as well as being on the IEEE Industrial Committee and active is supporting various section initiatives submitted our Section requirements by February 15th. Our past treasurer Bob Dawson, also our PACE chair continues to support us in maintaining the course.

Milestones that the Cedar Rapids Section would like to perpetuate and/or support are the Universal S-Band and GPS. At the OpCom 2019 we linked up with the Region 6 Coastal Las Angeles Section GPS advocates that we are now working with to further along the GPS milestone event

(http://ieeemilestones.ethw.org/Milestone-Proposal:Global Positioning System (GPS), 1973). Many of our IEEE members in the Cedar Rapids area have worked with GPS but many of those original engineers have moved out of the area but the GPS technology from that legacy is still a core area in Collins Aerospace. After watching the Collins legacy video and realizing the Deep Space network was established by use of the unified S-band for bundling multiple telemetry and communications channels we thought we should establish a milestone project for that. Our Vice Chair Bill Caldwell (also our Membership Development chair) found this being already established but not finished in the IEEE Milestone resource (http://ieeemilestones.ethw.org/Milestone-Proposal:Apollo Unified S-Band Communications System, 1969.) We would very much like to help fill out these TBDs as well.

Bill Caldwell has worked with Vickie Osborne to research and investigate the Organization Analytics (OC) resources and has established a comprehensive analysis of our Cedar Rapids Section OA. We are over 400 members in a variety of societies beyond those organized societies listed in our CR Section (http://sites.ieee.org/cedar-rapids/)

It is a continuous challenge to stay abreast of the tsunami of technology that is flooding our industrial fourth revolution. Our volunteers are involved in so many of these attributes and members are quite immersed in their careers. We are attempting to renew the vigor for IEEE in our section for existing members as well as bring into our fold the many engineers not yet members.
